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What we can look forward to in 2024.

As Pastor Woolsey commented at the beginning of the Annual Meeting "We do not have a deficit. We have an opportunity."

The 2024 Budget represents a ministry program based on growth. We are growing in new members with <u>over 50</u> adults and children that have recently joined. Especially young families with children and people from other congregations.

We are expanding ministry opportunities with:

A new Men's Ministry (more than 25 men signed up for the first meeting).

A growing youth ministry that also includes joint activities with St. Paul, Westlake.

We are doing things that expand the kingdom into the community. And we have an opportunity to contribute to something special that's not declining, like so many businesses and other churches and ministries around us.

As mentioned in the recent Constant Contact article, the Governing Board will spend time early in the new year looking at ways we can Re-Imagine our Congregation. Some very preliminary conversation has taken place with St. Paul, Westlake, and Hope Sheffield. Most of that conversation has been between the Pastors, Congregational Chairman and in reviewing some concerns all have expressed about the vitality of our Circuit churches. Many of which are in financial distress and some who are currently vacant (having no pastor) or who are in jeopardy of closing.

Since Re-Imagining is a relatively new program there is much uncertainty about how broadly we should be involved. Along with much conversation it will take baby steps to see where the opportunities lie for joint participation and mutual understanding. Our number one priority is the Call of a second pastor. That is where our emphasis is and while we will not neglect other ministry opportunities, the Call takes precedence. Every effort to communicate progress on the Call and any conversation regarding our ministry opportunities will be priority for the Governing Board.

God is blessing Faith Congregation in many ways and we praise and thank Him for all that He has done and for the opportunities He showers us with every day.

In this edition of *What Does It Take*, I want to bring to light a number of ministries that enhance our church ministry here at Faith Avon. Also, I'd to recognize several individuals who make our ministry the growing success that it is. And, to ensure that we put our best foot forward to visitors and others in our community.

During the second service on September 10th, 2023, we recognized two sets of teachers and leaders. Pastor installed several people who have volunteered to be teachers in either our Adult Bible Study, Sunday School, or Confirmation Program, and the leaders of our Youth Ministry Program. These faithful members are entrusted with sharing the love of Christ to the children and friends of the congregation from the very young among us to the young adults who crave more knowledge and want to discuss the teachings of Christ and His Apostles.

The teachers installed on that day were our exceptional Pre-School Staff and our Director, Michele Herner. Michele is celebrating her 10th year as Pre-School Director. Our pre-school is recognized by many as the premier pre-school in the area. It is one of the congregations' most prominent outreach ministries, one we can all take pride in!

We also recognized twoteachers for their years of service to the pre-school. Tonya Miller and Ciara Ruckman who have 5 years of consecutive service (and a few additional years non-consecutive in total). Every year we have new parents who entrust their children to our Christian teaching and care who were referred to us by former school parents. Many parents have had several children attend our program. Check it out. And when the opportunity arises, please, take a child's name and be their Prayer Buddy this school year.

Another outreach ministry that is so important and needed in Lorain County is the work of LOVE, Inc. Love, In the Name of Christ. Jennifer Tucker is the leading advocate for this ministry and represents our congregation so well. She enlists other volunteers from within the congregation and our response to LOVE, Inc's area programs have always been most gracious and supported both financially and materially. Jennifer is always looking for more volunteers to help with the many different aspects of this ministry. Please consider reaching out to her for ways in which you might help. Our Pastor Woolsey is a Board member at Love, Inc. and a strong supporter of this vital ministry. There are opportunities here where you can make a difference. Lastly, I want to recognize the Facility and Grounds team. Led by Mike Emling there are many activities that take place weekly that enable the church and grounds to be a pleasant and attractive place of worship. Where a visitor's first impression of our church and congregation is established with a positive and welcoming impression. Until recently, Elizabeth Schuster oversaw custodial responsibilities and kept our facility clean and sparkling. Cleaning and scrubbing each week so people felt comfortable and safe. Doing the little things that count most.

I encourage your participation in one or more of the ministries or committees that would welcome your help as a volunteer. The praise band meets on Saturday mornings, and is working to bring new music to the congregation once a month.


It was a blast merging with the traditional service choir for Christmas Eve. We look forward to more combined music for future events.

If you know anyone interested come see me or email me! We are flexible with schedules and commitments!






Preschool Winter Happenings

Orphan Grain Train (OGT) touches millions of lives around the world by shipping donated foods, clothing, medical supplies and other needed items to the people in the US and 70 other countries, especially in times of disaster. This Lutheran volunteer network always tries to work through the churches, so the Gospel accompanies the assistance given. The funds will support a new project in the Nebraska site. Mercy Meals will be expanded from five million meals to ten million meals.

Dakota Boys and Girl Ranch, a healing Space for At-Risk Children from ages 10-18, who have faced heartbreaking abuse, neglect, and trauma. Most of the children have little to no faith background and are learning about Jesus, and the discovery of our Savior's mercy is often the most vital part of a child's healing. The campus includes a gym, school and therapy rooms. The funds will help with the building of a new specialized chapel, where those precious children can know and experience Christ's mercy and Healing power.


