LET'S CHOOSE GOD

Stewardship is a very important part of our faith and relationship with Jesus Christ. Stewards are defined as managers, treasurers or ones who take care of the master's business until he returns. When we make the commitment to follow Christ we become Stewards of His kingdom. Managers of the resources God grants to us. Psalm 24:1 says "The earth is the Lord's, and everything in it, the world, and all who live in it." When we understand that everything belongs to God and NOT to us, and that we are appointed to manage His resources, our notion of ownership ends and stewardship begins.

What are we stewards of? God grants each of us a different number of resources to use but we all have the ability to wisely use what we have to enhance His kingdom. Like our time, our talents, our resources, our bodies, the spreading of the Gospel and yes, our finances and much more.

Imagine you can store your resources in a bucket. Like one of those bright orange buckets from Home Depot. Now think of your resources as cups of water. You can add and subtract from your bucket for various things. Add a cup of water to represent your paycheck or add a cup of water to represent something unusually good that happened to you when you least expected or add a cup of water when you received a special gift. You put these "resources" into your bucket and see the bucket fill. Perhaps you must pay some bills, take a cup of water out of the bucket. You want to treat someone to a lunch or dinner or a nice time out. Some of your resources (cups of water) will have to come out of the bucket. You get the picture. Either way there is a supply and demand function taking place.

When we accept Jesus Christ into our lives though, a new source comes into play. We no longer own the bucket. We no longer own the resources. We do, however, have access on how to decide how to use them. We are now Stewards. Imagine all the amazing things we can do now. Think of all the people we can bless and all the ministries that could flourish or that could be started. God's love can work into every facet of our lives.

Unfortunately, things don't always play out the way we plan or expect. We often have a natural tendency to revert to our old ways. To claiming an ownership viewpoint of these resources that we have been blessed with. The common misconception is "I have earned this." "I deserve this." "This is mine." This mindset puts a lid on our bucket. We shut God out. This is the basis of poor stewardship. That is not to say you can't still do great things with what you have, but you have removed God from the process and now some resources are being wasted. We aren't able to utilize all of God's blessings. We cannot serve two masters. On the contrary, when we remove the lid and submit fully to serving God in every aspect of our lives the dynamics of stewardship change dramatically.

Our God is not a thief. Taking our resources for some nefarious purpose. These offerings, tithes and sacrifices we give to Him are going to be blessed and used in some amazing ways to transform lives in His kingdom. He uses ordinary people in a broken world. It creates a foundation of love by offering ourselves to His will and allowing the Holy Spirit to work transparently through us in a powerful way. Lives will be changed; miracles will happen and broken people can learn that they are sons and daughters of a loving God.

We will become great stewards. Our buckets will always be changing. In some cases, they will seem empty and in other cases they will be overflowing. In all cases, God will use us to accomplish incredible things. Stewardship is a choice. Following Jesus is an opportunity for life everlasting but it is also an opportunity for you to share that love of God and lead others to receiving everlasting life. Let's choose God.


